## DEATH OF AN INDIAN MUTINY VETERAN

Very few of the soldiers who served our country in the dark and bloody days of the Indian Mutiny survive, most of them having passed away. One of the two sole remaining veterans in Forres, who took part in that terrible war, has answered the last roll-call, in the person of Mr. John Macrae, late of the 92nd Gordon Highlanders, who died at Caroline Place here on Friday morning at the age of seventy-two, after three months painful suffering from catarrh. The other survivor is Mr. John Fraser, late porter of Leancoil Hospital here, who is happily still with us and in the enjoyment of wonderful health.

A native of Inverness, Mr. Macrae enlisted in 92nd Gordon Highlanders at Nairn on the 12th December 1855 at the age of eighteen, a year after the memorable battles of the Alma, Balaclava and Inkerman and the subsequent siege of Sebastopol. In 1858 he sailed for India with his regiment and fought throughout the whole of the mutiny enduring all the hardships that were suffered by our soldiers on the burning plains of India, in that campaign of carnage and treachery and hereby earning the Indian Mutiny Medal. After ten years' service in the army, during which he held a reputation as a capable marksman, being the best in his company, he joined the reserve in which he served for twenty one years.

He spent the last thirty-two years of his life in Forres, and about two years' ago was he was granted a pension out of Lord Robert's Veteran Fund. He leaves a widow and five daughters and six sons, the survivors of a family of sixteen, to who sympathy is extended in their bereavement. Deceased was buried at Cluny Hill Cemetery on Sunday afternoon with military honours' the mournful and impressive funeral being witnessed by large crowds of the public as it slowly wended its way to the burying ground, to the weird and solemn strains of the pibroch. The procession was headed by a firing party of the Forres Territorials, followed by the band and pipers, and then proceeded by Mr. John Fraser, was the coffin draped with the Union Jack and borne on the shoulders of the members of Forres Soldier's Association who wearing their medals paraded in full force to pay a last tribute of respect to their departed comrade. The rear was brought up by a large gathering of the general public and a company of territorials under the command of Lieut. G.W. Asher and Second Lieut. A.D. Macdonald. Rev. A.C. Buchanan conducted the burial service at the house and grave. The devotions at the cemetery were followed by three volleys, the pipes playing "Lochaber No More" after which the Last Post was sounded on the bugle. 3. **Kenneth Macrae**, b. 1849 at Beauly, occupation Professional Athlete, d. 25 Aug 1929 at 40 Old Edinburgh Road, Inverness, buried in Croy Churchyard Croy Invernesshire. Some records state he was born at Whinhill Beauly, he was at the age of 12 employed by Mr. Anderson of Lochdu Farm Nairn to look after the cattle on the farm. Kenneth then entered the Whisky industry in which his first wife's father was employed. After the death of Elspet, Kenneth returned to Nairnshire and left his two sons to be brought up by Elspet's parents. In the summer he worked on Nairnshire Farms and in the winter at Edinburgh Gas Works. Kenneth was 6ft 2 in height and 15 stone of a lean build. He had first been encouraged to participate in the heavy events at the local Highland Games by Mr. Anderson. Kenneth or Kenny as he was known was a specialist in the Hammer events although he took part in all events. In the 1880's he became Scottish Champion winning all events at Edinburgh Exhibition in 1886 and the following year at the Paris Exhibition where he won both hammer events and the caber. In the 1890's Kenny was given the title of World Champion. In his latter years he worked for John McDonald Timber Merchant's Inverness and was a member of that company's tug of war team in his late 50's
