A Statement of all the People Inn the Esteat of Lethen who Pay for Cotter Houses to Tennants  
(2 lists, 1846 & 1847, compiled by John Cameron)

Parish of Auldearn:

James Mackintosh Dalmor

(1846) has two John Tulloch and a Taylor man who have [Families] young, say the men from thirty to forty years of age non of them Born in the Parish, Both in ordinary Circumstances in Lif.

(1847) has two John Tulloch Labouring man, and a Taylor who have Famelies young say the men from thirty to forty years of Age Non of them Born Inn the Parish Both Inn ordinary Circumstances Inn Lif

Alexander Walker Brightmony

(1846) has four besids one of his Servants has a hous, two of them workmen John Logan & John Macklannan, say from thirty to forty years of Age In Ordinary Circumstances in Lif and has Famelies non of them Born in the Parish, Widow Murdach Born in the Parish of Ardclach, Two other wiman not verry long Residing in the Parish

(1847) has Three and one of his Servants has a hous. John Logan a Workman his famely weel up and himself about forty years of Age. Widow Murdach hir Famely All Grown up She was Born In the Parish of Ardclach. Two Sisters say about thirty years of Age who works for Mr Walker oqupies the third hous, all said to be Inn ordinary Circumstances Inn Lif

David Williamson in Cottertown

(1846) has one, an old Woman, I do not think she pays any thing

(1847) There is an old Woman Inn Cottertown she pays nothing for hir hous

Alexander Davidson Little Clun

(1846) has three Hugh Fraser and John Cameron and Mary Macgillivray All in ordinary Circumstances in Lif and the two men there Famelies are Grown up the men about Sixty years of Age and all of them Born In or verry near the Parish

(1847) has three Hugh Fraser a Wright and John Cameron and Mary Macgillivray, the men about sixty years of Age and Inn ordinary Circumstances Inn Lif there Famelies Grown up and all of them Born Inn the Parish

Widow Forsyth Clun [1846] Charles Forsyth Clun [1847]

(1846) has four William MacGillivran Shoemaker and Widow Fraser, James Campbell and Duncan Mackintyre all but Mackintyre Born In or near there Preasant Place of Resedence all with the Exeption of Widow Fraser in ordinary Circumstances in Lif and hir Famely is Generally Grown up and part of them are Married she but in Poor Circumstances of Lif

(1847) has four James Campbell, Duncan Mackintyre and Widow Davidson, the men has famelies but hir Famelie is Grown up, Lickways Campbells, Mackintyres is yet young, all Born Inn the Parishes of Ardclach or Aldern but Duncan Mackintyre who is not verr long In the Parish he appears to be about from fifty to sixty years of Age. Campbell is sixty. William Macgillivray shoemaker is Just now Preparing to Go to America and Need not be In the account

Parish of Ardclach:

William Urquhart in Lakin

(1846) has one Wm Rose a man about fifty years of Age not a Resedintar in the Parish in ordinary Circumstances in Lif his Famely well Grown up

(1847) *no entry*

Alexander Mackarthur Achamore

(1846) has one a workman say about forty to fifty years of Age In ordinary Circumstances in Lif his Famely young and not a Resedentar in the Parish

(1847) has a workman say about forty or fifty years of age has a Famely and not long in this Place

Hugh Clunas in Mill of Flinas

(1846) has one Jas. Clunas a Mason his Son In Law and in Easie Circumstances In Lif has a young Famelie and Born In the Parish of Aldern

(1847) has one his Son Inn Law has a young Famely in Easie Circumstances Inn Lif himself about thirty eight years of Age Born Inn the Parish of Aldern

#### Duncan Mackdonald in Flinas

(1846) has one Jas. Fraser a Poor working man and his Famely well Grown up has been in the Parish for a long tim say about fifty or sixty years of Age

(1847) has one a Poor working man his Famely weel Grown up has Been Inn the Parish a long tim say from fifty to sixty years of Age

#### William Grant in Flinas

(1846) has two Both Poor Treadsmen the one, Mackintosh, a Shoemaker the other Wm Lawson a Wright Both Born In the Nighbourhead of where they now Dwell

(1847) has two Both Poor Treadsmen the one a Wright the other a Shoemaker, Lawson the Wright his Famely Grown up is himself from Sixty to Seventy years of Age, the Shoemaker from forty to fifty years has a young Famely Both Born in the Parish

#### Alexander Alexander in Rihaury

(1846) has two the one his Brother John Alexander a Meason, and the other his Brother In Law Benjamin Mackintosh a working man Both in ordinary Circumstances in Lif about Fifty years of Age and has Famelies yet but young

(1847) has one his Brother Inn Law a working Man about fifty years of Age Inn ordinary Circumstances in Lif has a famely young not a Native of the Parish

#### Hugh Falconer Remore [1846] Widow Falcnor Remore [1847]

(1846) has two Both men of Famelies say young, the one Jas. Glass a Shoemaker, the other a Working man John Mackrichie and James Glass Both in ordinary Circumstances In Lif Nither Born In the Parish but Long Residentars in it

(1847) has two the one a Shoemaker about twenty five years of Age for the most Part of his Lif a Resedentar In the Parish if not Born in it has newly Married has one Child, the other a Labouring man has a Famely and has been in the Parish these Nineteen years, Both Inn ordinary Circumstances Inn Lif the last mentioned about forty or forty five years of Age

#### Docter Cuppar Fornighty

(1846) has two David Mitchell Black Smith and Mary Lawson a County Merchant Both in ordinary Circumstances in Lif and say from fifty to sixty years of Age and Both Resedentars In the Parish

(1847) has three David Mitchell Blacksmith and Mary Lawson Country Merchant, she has no Famely and about sixty years of age Inn Easie Circumstances In Lif, Mitchell has a Famely young Inn ordinary Circumstances in Lif. William Mackarthur has a hous but is Purposing to Leave it at Every term these two years as it is all but fallen down, he has a Famely young, him and Mitchell are about from forty to forty five years of Age, all the three Born Inn the Parishes of Ardclach or Aldern

#### Robart Mackintosh in Belivat

(1846) has three but I do not think that John Mackdonald Wivar Pays any thing for his hous but got it from the Let Leddie of Lethen and Retains it by Permission of the Propriator – the other two John Mackgillivray let in Keppernach and Jannet Macklen said to be In ordinary Circumstances in Lif

(1847) has three John Mackdonald and John Macgillivray let at Kepernach and Jannet Macklen, All of them Born In the Parish. Mackdonald is said to Pay nothing as he Got the hous from the Let Leddy of Lethen and Retains it by Permission of the Propriator

#### John Mackbain in Belivat

(1846) has four John Duglas, and one Noble a Taylor, and one Mackween a Merchant in the small Countrie way, thes three are In ordinary Circumstances in Lif and all apears to be about from forty to fifty years of Age. John Duglas has a small Famely and Kenneth Urquchart his Father In Law but I do not think he pays any thing for his hous

(1847) has four Kenneth Urquchart his Father Inn Law, John Duglas a Wright, one Noble a Taylor and Mackween a Countrie Merchant. Duglas Born In the Parish has a Famely young and but in Poor Circumstances Inn Lif. Macqueen Born In the Parish Inn Ordinary Circumstances. Noble not long Residind In the Parish has a Famely not all Grown up said to be In ordinary Circumstances In Lif

Widow Davidson in Little Culmony

(1846) has three one occupied by a Servant and other two a Charles Ross a Labour and Donaldson a Shoemaker Both Middle Aged men Ross his Family well up and Both In ordinary Circumstances of Life

(1847) has two Charles Ross and one Donaldson a Shoemaker both In ordinary Circumstances In Life and have families Rosses is Grown up both the men from forty to fifty years of age. There are a house Lickways occupied by a Servant

The Reverend Hugh Mackbain Ardclach

(1846) has two Lachlan Mackbain and John Grant Both working men say above sixty years of Age and their Families well up and In but ordinary Circumstances in Life

(1847) has two Lachlan Mackbain and John Grant both their families well up In ordinary Circumstances In Life and themselves about sixty years of Age. Grant Born in the Parish. Mackbain Nearly twenty years [Residing] in Ardclach

John Mackillican Achagour

(1846) has four one occupied by his Mother In Law let Tennant on the Farm, the other three William Duglall, Anne Macklen, William Fraser a Shipard, the two first has no Families and not old People, Fraser his Family well up all In ordinary Circumstances of Life

(1847) has five his Mother In Law who occupied the Farm before him, William Douglas a Sayer and Anne Macklean these two young People, William Fraser a Shipard all the above In ordinary Circumstances In Life, and Valaintain Mackay who occupied the Farm of Romachroy Lettly and In but Poor Circumstances In Life, these last two about sixty years of Age

John Kennedy Laybratich

(1846) has two William Fletcher and Widow Mackintosh. She is In ordinary Circumstances in Life. Fletcher very Poor so far as I can see

(1847) has two Widow Mackintosh and William Fletcher Both in but Poor Circumstances and Both Born In the Parish and now about sixty years of Age

John Rose Daltera

(1846) has two Volantain Mackay a Meason In Poor Circumstances In Life his Family well Grown up and Donald Mackintosh a Pencenar with about one Shilling a day and his Family Grown up

(1847) has now only one as Valantin Mackay Removed to Achagour when the House fell In Winter Last, the one is Donald Mackintosh a Penchener has a family Grown up and was Born In the Parish

Angus Mackpherson Dulcie Bridge

(1846) has one a Middle Aged man with a small Family said to be In Poor Circumstances In Life

(1847) has one a Poor man and his Family not all up he is not a Native of the Parish

Donald Munro Wester Dulcie

(1846) has two Frances Ross a Middle Aged man and in Easie Circumstances in Life and one Davidson in but Mean Circumstances an old man

(1847) has two Frances Ross a Wright and said to be in Easie Circumstances and a Native of the Parish about fifty years of Age, an old man the other In Poor Circumstances

Alexander Mackintosh Dunearn

(1846) has two Donald Mackween a young man a Wright and an old Woman Both said to be in Easie Circumstances in Life

(1847) has two Donald Mackqueen a Wright and an old Woman Both Natives of the Parish and in Easie Circumstances in Life

Alexander Calm in Colendown

(1846) has one his Mother who occupied the Farm Letly

(1847) has one his Mother who occupied the Farm before him. She is an old Woman and long in the Parish

James Smith Tamlachlin

(1846) has one a young man who now works the Farm

(1847) has one a young man Lettly Married and only one of a Famely. I do not think he works the Farm now

#### George Dunbar at Lethen Mill

(1846) There are two houses at Burnside one oqupied by the Blacksmith and another by the Saw Millar, John Steel and James Mackintosh, they are on that part of Georg Dunbars Farm Sittuated in the Parish of Aldern. I do not know how they Pay for there houses.

Lickways James Mackdonald the Under Millar at Lethen Mill his Hous is Sittuated in the Parish of Ardclach – I do not know how aney of the abouve three settles for what they Posses

(1847) has two houses at Burnsid the Smith and Saw Millar, thies houses are In the Parish of Aldern.

Lickways James Mackdonald whoes hous is sittuated In the Parish of Ardclach

Mother died, these two in Mean Circumstances

Jean Fraser oqupies a hous that she built when she Gave up the Farm of New Achagour this hous is  
Sittuated at Alexander Leslies at Remore

Isebella Mackintosh has a hous beside the School Hous of Ardclach, she got the hous repaired and  
went there to live when hir Sister Jannet died at Culmony. In all four houses not mentioned abouve
